Habitat for Humanity® is not a giveaway program. Through volunteer labor and donations of money and materials, Habitat affiliates can finance affordable loans at no profit and sell to partner families selected through nondiscriminatory policies.

These homeowners invest hundreds of hours of their own labor into building their Habitat house and the houses of others. Homeowners' monthly mortgage payments are used to build still more Habitat houses.

Habitat Texas is funded through affiliate dues, fees for services (such as energy testing and conference/training registrations) and grants.

This year, Habitat Texas will increase the number of learning opportunities and programs offered to affiliates so that every dollar invested in Habitat Texas can be leveraged throughout the state while promoting best practice nonprofit governance and increasing accountability in the complex world of mortgage programs.



Today, Habitat for Humanity® Texas coordinates efforts for more than **80** affiliates and **43** ReStores® statewide.

ReStores® are stores run by affiliates with their primary mission to provide additional funding to support house building goals. ReStores® sell everything from donated building supplies to household goods, at a reduced cost, allowing Habitat another avenue with which to serve the community.

Simple and decent

Most Habitat houses built in the US share the following characteristics:

- Living space of about 1,000 square feet (exact size depends on number of bedrooms)
- One bathroom
- Covered primary entrance
- 3' doorways and 3'4" hallways to allow wheelchair access.

While all Habitat house share similar design features, the differences in climate and construction techniques ensure ample individuality. Additionally, homeowners are given opportunities to customize their homes.

Sustainable construction practices

We build sustainably to take better care of our environment, our homeowners, and our volunteers. Our goals are to reduce the home's monthly and life cycle costs and increase efficiency and durability while providing healthy environments.

Accessibility

Throughout North America, Habitat affiliates are encouraged to build with special attention to wheelchair accessibility for both homeowners and visitors. Habitat builds energy efficient and sustainable house whenever possible.
